DEATH OF COLONEL BOND.

We regret to announce the death of Lieut.-Col. Charles Frederick Bond, who succumbed to an attack of jaundice at his residence, Carisbrooke, on Thursday evening last. The deceased was the son of Major and Brevet Lieut.-Col. Bond, of the 15th Hussars, and was educated at the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst. The deceased entered the Indian Army as ensign in 1854, was promoted to a lieutenancy in 1856, to a captaincy in 1865, and to a majority in 1875, retiring in 1877 on full pay and with the honorary rank of lieutenant-colonel. The whole of his service was in the 105th Regiment, formerly the Madras Light Infantry, and now styled the 2nd Battalion (King's Own) Yorkshire Light Infantry. Soon after his retirement Colonel Bond took up his residence at Southampton, and some years since he came to the Isle of Wight, where he continued to live up to the date of his decease, So far as years were concerned, the deceased was in the prime of life. He had lately become somewhat widely known in the Island from his connection with the late County Club, which he was instrumental in establishing, and his connection with which was not pecuniarily profitable to himself. He leaves a widow and a large family, with whom sincere sympathy is felt.
