# NEWPORT.

DEATH OF MR. W. T. BRIGHT.- We regret to record the death of Mr. William T. Bright, of Clovelly, Castle-road, at the age of 77. The deceased, who had been laid aside by a long illness due to his advanced age, was for many years senior partner in the firm of Messrs. Bright and Minns, in which he succeeded his late father. He was long actively associated with the musical life of the district, being one of the oldest members of the Amateur Orchestral Society. He was a skilful player on the bass and 'cello, and was an organist of considerable attainments, and as such occasionally did duty for others. On one occasion he had the honour of officiating in that capacity at the late Queen's private chapel at Osborne, in the time of the late Mr. William Scadding. He also acted as organist, years ago, at the Garrison Church, Parkhurst. He was highly esteemed for many estimable qualities, and much sympathy is felt for the widow and family in their bereavement. The funeral took place yesterday (Friday) at Carisbrooke, the Rev. T. Story Busher officiating. Mr. J.T. Read presided at the organ, and played suitable funeral music. There was a large attendance, and a numerous collection of beautiful floral tributes. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. W. Bright (son and daughter-in-law), Miss Bright and Miss M. Bright (daughters), Mr. W.E. Moon (Cowes), Miss Trusted, and Messrs W. and H.W. Minns, and H.W. Horan. Amongst those also attending were Messrs. S.C. Wadham (Mayor of Newport), R. Bird Chiverton, J.P., G.D. Rich, J.P., J. Way, D.S. Pring, G.A. Brannon, R. Lock, A.F. Shepard, C.M. Dabell, S. Wadham, L. Jordan, J.P., and A.W. Drew, Dr. J.B. McKay, Capt. E.
