#### MILITARY FUNERAL AT CARISBROOKE.

Yesterday (Friday) afternoon full military honours were accorded at Carisbrooke Cemetery to the late Pte. Richard Brown, 17<sup>th</sup> Battery R.F.A., who died at the County Asylum on Sunday. The deceased was only admitted to the institution 36 hours previously. He was invalided home from the Front, where his horse was shot from under him. The full band and drums and a firing party of the 3<sup>Rd</sup> Royal Wae Wickshire Regt. from Parkhurst attended, and the Rev. W.B. Dowding (Senior Chaplain to the Forces) officiated. The medical staff and officers of the County Asylum were present at the removal of the body, which was covered with the Union Jack and placed on a gun-carriage drawn by six horses. The deceased was a married man, his home being at Dorchester.
