Death of Mr. H. J. Caws. - The death occurred at 37 Trafalgar Road on Sunday of Mr. Hartley James Caws, aged 66, a native of Cowes, and a familiar figure both in that town and in Newport as a traveller in the grocery and provisions trade. During the second world war he joined the staff of Messrs. J. S. White, Ltd., as a works policeman. He retired from business in 1946 and had since been in poor health. His wife died in 1946 and he had been cared for by his son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. P. Oxley. He leaves five sons and three daughters. The funeral service at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Wednesday was conducted by the Vicar of St. John's (the Rev. S. F. Cooper). The mourners were Mr. J. Caws (son, also representing Mrs. O. H. Caws, Cowes, mother), Messrs. D., R., P., and G. Caws (sons); Messrs. C. Taylor, J. Cooper, and P. Oxley (son-in-law, also representing Mrs. R. Twyman, sister-in-law), Mr. P. Twyman (nephew), and Mr. Chapman. The wreaths included one from friends and neighbours in Trafalgar Road. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
