WELL KNOWN FARMER'S DEATH MR. A. B. CHEVERTON OF POLECLOSE

We regret to announce the death on Tuesday of Mr. Arthur Bird Cheverton, of Poleclose Farm, near Newport, at the early age of 49. Mr. Cheverton, who was a member of a well known Island family, was a son of the late Mr. W. H. Cheverton, who was in business as a harness maker in Lugley Street, Newport for many years. Educated at Portland House Academy, Newport, he studied farming under his uncle, Mr. E. G. Heal, J.P., C.A., of Newclose Farm, and later farmed at Medham before taking over Poleclose.

He was an active member of the Agricultural Executive Committee's inspection committee and chairman of the Milk Production Committee in 1948. An enthusiastic member of the N.F.U. he also did valuable work as chairman of the Carisbrooke Growmore Club. He was a founder member and presiding Full Corn (chairman) of the Wheatears, a social organization formed two years ago with its headquarters in Shalfleet. During the last war he was the popular sergeant of "D" company of the Newport Home Guard.

Mr. Cheverton had been in poor health for some time, following two major operations in 1950. He bore his illness with typical fortitude and was liked by everyone for his quiet disposition and unassuming manner. An enthusiastic angler, one of his greatest pleasures was to take out parties of friends in his motor-boat, and on Saturday he took part in a fishing competition at Atherfield.

Much sympathy is felt with his widow and baby daughter in their sudden bereavement. The funeral will be at the Quay Street Methodist Church, Newport, at 2.30 p.m. today, and the interment will be at Carisbrooke.
