Harry Thomas Coombes

NEWPORT

Well-known Saddler.—Mr. Harry Thomas Coombes, aged 64, one of the few remaining master saddlers in the country, died suddenly on Sunday at St. Mary's Hospital after a seizure which occurred on Saturday shortly after he returned home from his Nodehill shop. Mr. Coombes resided at Freshfields, 32, Alderbury Road.

His reputation for craftsmanship had spread far beyond the Island. He had had special orders from horse owners in Canada, United States and South Africa. Mr. Coombes was born in Clifford Street and attended what is now the C.E. Primary School. He was a choir-boy at St. Thomas's Church and a member of the Bible class, as well as of their athletic team, for which he used to run in local sports meetings.

During the war he was a special constable. In 1928 he married Miss Catherine MacPherson, whom he had known since he was 17. They had two children, Pamela and Maureen. Mr. Coombes was also a saddler-sergeant in the Territorials until the outbreak of the last war.

The funeral service took place at St. Thomas's Church on Thursday, followed by interment at Carisbrooke. The Rev. J. Evans (rector of Gatcombe) officiated. The mourners were Mrs. C. Holland, Mr. G. Withers and Mr. W. Smith. Mrs. F. Robbins (sister-in-law) was unable to attend.
