THE DEATH. - of Mr. George Coombs, which took place at his residence, Clatterford House, Carisbrooke, on Thursday last, removes a familiar figure from our midst. He was formerly headmaster of the Isle of Wight Diocesan School, and the intelligence of his decease will be received with regret by many "old boys" who received their education at the once well-known scholastic institution which he so ably conducted. He had reached octogenarian years, and his death occurred after a very short but severe attack of bronchitis. The funeral will take place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Tuesday next, at 11 a.m.
