Much sympathy is extended to the widow, who had been deceased's partner in life for over 49 years, and they would have celebrated their golden wedding in August next. The funeral took place on Saturday at Carisbrooke Cemetery, conducted by Messrs. W. Tyler, J. Lock, and E. A. Walmesley, of the Holyrood-hall. The mourners were the widow, Mr. and Mrs. E. A.
