DENTON. – We regret to record the death, which took place on Monday afternoon, after a brief and painful illness, of a well-known and much esteemed tradesman of the town, in the person of Mr. W. J. Denton, pork butcher, carrying on business in High-street and residing in Carisbrooke-road. The deceased was seen at business so recently as the previous Friday, and the news of his death, coming as it did to many as the first intimation that anything was wrong, naturally caused a painful sensation. During the last month he and his family had to mourn the loss of his 3-year-old son, and the sincerest sympathy is with the widow, who is left with a large family of young children, in her great bereavement. Though he had filled no public office, the deceased had rendered service to the community in various ways, and he was a friend of healthy recreation and sport, having presented a cup for competition a few years ago among the running members of the I.W. Amateur Athletic Club, the juvenile section of which had in him a warm supporter, and for some years he was a valued member and supporter of the Carisbrooke Bowling Club. He was a member of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, who will doubtless be largely represented at the funeral, which takes place to-morrow afternoon at Carisbrooke Cemetery.
