SUDDEN DEATH AT PARKHURST PRISON. – On Saturday last Patrick Donoghue, assistant warder at Parkhurst Prison, was at the pay office with others, waiting to receive his pay, and uttered a complaint as to some uneasiness of the heart, and immediately he fell dead. Deceased, who had seen some active service in the army, was 33 years of age, and unmarried. Heart disease was the cause of death.

SUDDEN DEATH. - On the forenoon of Friday last, a warder at Parkhurst Convict Prison, named Donoghue whilst going into the steward's office to receive his pay, fell down and suddenly expired. He was a single man and about 43 [??] years of age. It was not considered necessary to hold a coroner's inquest on the body, as the cause of death was clearly ascertained to arise from disease of the heart. The deceased was buried at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Monday afternoon, and was followed to the grave by a number of his brother officers, as well as by a considerable number of the Newport Foresters' Lodge, wearing their sashes and other badges of office, the deceased having been at member of the Order.
