WELL KNOWN DAIRYMAN'S SUDDEN DEATH. – Mr. William Dove, a member of an old and esteemed local family, who for over 40 years, until his retirement six years ago, carried on business as a dairyman and milk purveyor at Stile House Dairy, Trafalgar-road, passed away in his sleep early on Thursday morning at his residence 27 Elm-grove. Mr. Dove had had a bilious attack earlier in the week, but had apparently fully recovered and was out attending to his poultry at Westminster on Wednesday. He seemed to be in his normal health on retiring, but on waking just before 5 a.m. Mrs. Dove found that he had passed away. Mr. Dove was particularly well known in the town and greatly esteemed, and the nature of his passing has aroused deep sympathy with his widow and two daughters. Mrs. Dove has been a devoted worker for the Parish Church for many years and is the local hon. secretary of the C.E. Walfs and Strays Society. The facts were reported to the Deputy Coroner (Mr. Francis A. Joyce) who ordered a post mortem examination, but it was not found necessary to hold an inquest. The funeral will be on Tuesday; service at St. John's Church at noon.
