Octogenarian ex-Harness Maker's Death. – Many friends will learn with deep regret of the unexpected death at the County Hospital on Thursday of Mr. Samuel Elliott, of 4 Westminster Terrace, Drill Hall-road. He was in his 84th year and his death occurred following removal to the hospital for treatment for an internal complaint. A harness maker by trade, Mr. Elliott was employed for 47 years, first by the late Mr. W. M. Coombes and then his son, the late Mr. W. T. Coombes, at their well known establishment in Nodehill. He retired about 12 years ago. A keen churchman, Mr. Elliott regularly attended the Parish Church, where he was a sidesman, and was present at the service on Sunday. He was a keen horticulturist, of a quiet, friendly nature, and will be missed by many. His wife died about 11 years ago. The funeral will probably take place on Monday.
