## GENERAL INTELLIGENCE.

Another survivor of Waterloo has just died, in his 90<sup>th</sup> year, viz., Lieutenant-Colonel Francis Feneran, senior paymaster of the army. The deceased enlisted as a private soldier at the time of the Peninsular War, and served in the ranks during the campaign in Holland in 1814, and at Waterloo in the following year. He received a commission as quartermaster when the 95<sup>th</sup> (Derbyshire) Regiment was raised for service in 1823, and was subsequently paymaster to the regiment from 1837 to 1854, when he was appointed to the depot battalion at Parkhurst. Lieutenant-Colonel Feneran finally retired upon half-pay when the depot battalions were reduced in 1870, and he was given a pension four years ago for his long and faithful services.
