CARISBROOKE.

DEATH OF AN OLD INHABITANT. – Death has claimed an old and respected inhabitant of this village in the person of Mr. James Ginger, 63, who for the past 21 years was gardener to the late Major Bowles, at Castlehurst. Deceased, who had been suffering for a considerable time from a painful malady, came here from Watford, Herts, where he was formerly gardener to Miss Boodle for 24 years. These two periods sufficiently indicate the valued and faithful service of deceased in his horticultural pursuits. His wife predeceased him nearly 20 years. The funeral took place on Sunday at Carisbrooke Cemetery, the Rev. A.H.C. Edlin officiating. The Misses Bowles and the servants at Castlehurst were present at the service, in addition to the relatives, who included Miss Ginger (sister), Mr. G. Reeves, Mrs Bullock, Mr. H. Barton, Mr. H. Bullock, and deceased's five sons, Messrs. William J., Walter G., Edward, Arthur, and Albert Ginger. Another son of deceased is a Bible Christian minister, who it will be remembered left some years ago to labour in the Colonies. Those sending wreaths in addition to the relatives were the Misses Bowles, Miss Boodle (Herts), the servants at Castlehurst, and Mr. and Mrs. Peck (Castle Hotel).
