### DEATH OF MR. F. B. T. GOLDSTONE.

With regrets we have to record the death of Mr. Frederick Benjamin Theodore Goldstone, which took place at his residence in West-end-terrace on Thursday last. The deceased, who had been for some time in failing health, was in his 70<sup>th</sup> year. He was for upwards of a quarter of a century the manager of the Newport branch of the Capital and Counties (formerly the Hampshire) Bank, which position he vacated at the end of the year 1888, the directors marking their sense of his long and faithful service by making him a handsome retiring allowance. During his connection with the Bank he acted as treasurer to a number of public bodies, and he so performed the duties of every position that he filled as to inspire the confidence and command the esteem of all who came in contact with him. He was well-known in all parts of the Island, and the universal testimony will be that he was a good and worthy citizen, who acquitted himself honestly and bore himself honourably in every relation of life. In the name of this community we offer an expression of sincerest sympathy with Mrs. Goldstone and her family in their bereavement.
