## **NEWPORT**

**The Late Mr. Godfrey Harrington.**—The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Wednesday of the late Mr. Godfrey Harrington, a highly-respected and popular young officer at Parkhurst Prison. Deceased succumbed to an attack of pneumonia on Sunday. He came to Parkhurst Barracks as a corporal in the 3rd Batt. King's Royal Rifles in 1891, and for a time played for the Newport Football Club. He left the Army in 1897 and joined the Prison Service, but was called up on the Reserve at the time of the South African war. He was invalided home from South Africa and at the termination of the war again took up his appointment at the Prison, in which service he had been for 12 years. Deceased was one of six brothers in the same regiment, none below the rank of sergeant and all wearing war decorations. One brother had just retired with the rank of captain. His father was also sergeant-major of the same corps. The funeral service was conducted by the Rev. Father Bembyr. The chief mourners were Colour-Sergt. Harrington (brother), Mr. Hookey (father-in-law), and Messrs. Hookey (brothers-in-law). The coffin was borne to the grave on the shoulders of six warders, and there were about 30 following in charge of Principal Warder Arnett. The coffin bore the following inscription: "Godfrey Harrington, died March 7th, 1909, aged 36 years". There were wreaths from his loving wife and children, Ada and Harry, his brothers William, Henry, Arthur, and Bart, Jim and Fanny and child, Berth, Bob, and our father, and the officers Parkhurst Prison. The deceased leaves a widow and three children to mourn his loss.
