NEWPORT.

THE FUNERAL – of the late Mr. Glendower Hawthorn, of the Halfway House, Hunnyhill, an ex-sapper of the R.E., who died after failing to pass the medical examination when called up for the war took place at Carisbrooke on Sunday last amidst many manifestations of sympathy and respect. N.C.O.s of the Hants Regiment and R.E. Territorials acted as bearers, with Sergt. F. Smith and Q.M.S. Smallwood as pall bearers. The coffin was of polished elm, with brass fittings and embossed breast-plate which bore the following inscription: “Glendower Hawthorn, died Oct. 15th, 1914, aged 36 years.” The mourners were the mother, Mr. H. Hawthorn (brother), Mr. D. Sebborn, and Miss F. Sebborn, representatives from the Old Comrades Association R.E. and the Licensed Victuallers Association, Messrs. F. Downer, A. Peck, J.H. McQueen, and many other military and civilian friends.
