Death of Mr. A. E. Hayles.- An old and respected resident has been removed by the death on Monday, at the age of 71, of Mr. Albert Edward Hayles, of Lugley Cottage, Lugley-street. A member of a well known local family and an old boy of Portland House Academy, Mr. Hayles was for 41 years an esteemed member of the staff of the well known firm of solicitors, Messrs. Buckell and Drew, first with the late Mr. W. D. Way Buckell and latterly with the present firm. He held the position of accountant until 1923, since when he had lived in retirement. For exactly 50 years he had been a member of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows. He had few interests outside his work. He lived very quietly, but was responsible for many unostentatious kindnesses to those in less fortunate circumstances than himself, and he will be greatly missed. The funeral took place very quietly on Thursday, there being no flowers, at deceased's request. The interment at Carisbrooke Cemetery was preceded by a service in the cemetery chapel, the Rev. E. G. Keed officiating. The mourners were Messrs. R. A. H. Sibley, J. B. Bulstrode, and A. S. Bunce. Mr. A. W. Drew, Mr. W. D. W. Buckell, and Mr. R. D. Whittingham, principals of the firm of Buckell and Drew, attended and members of the staff present were Messrs. W. H. Urry and R. W. Leal. Others attending included Messrs. H. Warder, J. H. Black, H. Croucher, W. S. Warne, W. Flux, and S. Cheeseman. Messrs. H. and F. Damp made the arrangements.
