The Late Mr. H. P. Hendy.- The death occurred on Sunday of Mr. Henry Percy Hendy, aged 67, of 34 Alvington Road. Previously employed by Messrs. H. W. Morey and Sons, Mr. Hendy had worked for Messrs. W. B. Mew, Langton and Co. for the last 18 years as a cooper. He served in the Royal Artillery during the first world war and had fought at Mons. Mr. Hendy was well known locally, having been secretary of the Cottage and Garden Society under the presidency of the late Mr. A. E. Harvey. He was also a former member of the Carisbrooke and Gatcombe Burial Board and the Carisbrooke Council. In recent years Mr. Hendy was a committee member of the football club and secretary of the ladies football club. He was also a member of the Odd Fellows, the Buffaloes, and Old Contemptibles. He leaves a wife, son, and three daughters. The funeral took place on Wednesday at the cemetery, when the Rev. Dr. W. H. Mildon officiated. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. G. H. B. Hendy (son and daughter-in-law), Miss P. Hendy and Miss D. Hendy (daughters), Mr. P. R. Strickland (son-in-law, also representing his wife), Messrs. A. and J. Hendy (brothers), Mr. J. Early (brother-in-law, also representing his wife), Mr. F. Richardson and daughter (brother-in-law and niece), Mr. and Mrs. G. Parker (brother and sister-in-law), and Mr. R. and Mrs. F. Hillier (nephew and sister-in-law), and representatives of his work mates and many clubs and societies to which he belonged were also present. The directors and staff of Messrs. W. B. Mew, Langton and Co. were represented and sent a wreath. - Mrs. Hendy and family wish to thank all relatives and friends for the floral tributes and letters received.
