SUDDEN DEATH. – F.E. Blake, Esq., jun., deputy coroner, held an inquest at the Falcon Inn, New-village, Newport, on the body of Mrs. Elizabeth Henton, aged 77, who was found dead in her bed. – George Bush said: I live at Mr. Deighton's, and the deceased was the mother of Mrs. Deighton, who resided with her daughter. Mrs. Henton was much troubled with asthma, and had been confined to her bed since Tuesday last. At 9 p.m. on Friday last, I carried her supper to her, consisting of a little rum and water and a small piece of bread, which was her usual supper. She ate her supper, and when I left her she seemed in about her usual state of health. Next morning, at 8 o'clock, on going into her bedroom to see how she was, I found her lying on her back, with her eyes closed, and on touching her and seeing that she was dead, I went and told Mr. and Mrs. Deighton of it, who immediately sent for Dr. Tuttiett. After Mr. and Mrs. Deighton and Dr. Tuttiett had been examined, the jury brought in a verdict of died from natural causes.
