DEATH OF A LICENSED VICTUALLER'S WIFE. – Much sympathy has been felt with Mr. Frank Hill, formerly an officer at H.M. Prison, Parkhurst, and now landlord of the Castle and Banner, Hunnyhill, in the loss he has suffered by the death of his wife, Mrs. Jannette Victoria Hill, aged 44, which took place on Wednesday after an illness of six months and only a short period of married life. The deceased was the eldest daughter of the late Mr. W. S. Ledicott, who was well known as an antique dealer of Holyrood-street. She was a member of the choir of the R.C. Church of St. Thomas of Canterbury, of which her sister is the organist, and before her marriage was for 26 years in the employ of Messrs. Bright and Minns. The funeral will take place on Saturday.
