INQUEST IN A CHAPEL. – An inquiry was opened at Gunville Chapel, on Friday, before Mr. H.R. Hooper, deputy coroner for the Island, touching on the death of George Henry Jolliffe, of Gunville, who died very suddenly on Thursday morning at half-past 12. – The wife of the deceased, Eliza Jolliffe, deposed that her husband was at that hour indoors dozing in his arm-chair. She noticed the peculiar appearance of his eyes. He was 42 years of age. Dr. Hutton Castle said that he was summoned to attend the deceased between 12 and 1 on the preceding day. When he arrived the deceased had been dead about ten minutes. From a *post mortem* examination he found the heart was very much diseased – evidently from long standing. There was a large quantity of blood in the heart, showing that it had suddenly ceased to act. He was of opinion that the deceased had suffered from rheumatism of the heart. – Verdict accordingly.
