A TRADESMAN'S DEATH. – We regret to record the death of Mr. Frank Kimber, blacksmith, of Snooke's-hill, which took place on Monday after a short illness from pleurisy. During the last few years deceased came somewhat prominently into public notice by unsuccessfully contesting several elections of different public bodies. He was an ardent Liberal, a vice-president of the local Liberal Association, and a committeeman of the local branch of the P.S.A., and at his funeral at Carisbrooke Cemetery yesterday (Friday) afternoon representatives of those two organisations attended as mourners. Deceased, who was in the prime of life, leaves a widow and large family, for who much sympathy is felt.
