LEDICOTT. – The death occurred on Thursday at his residence, 42 Crocker-street, after a seven years' illness, of Mr. William Smith Ledicott, aged 78, well known throughout the Island as the proprietor of the "old curiosity shop" in Holyrood-street, and an expert dealer in curios and antiques. He was an ardent Conservative, and at election times past days were clever and amusing with his caricatures and poetic and other squibs. The eldest surviving son, C.Q.M.S. Ledicott (Lincolnshire Regiment), was unable to be present owing to being at the Front.
