#### NEWPORT.

**DEATH OF MR. JAMES LININGTON.** – We regret to have to record the death of Mr. James Linington, a highly-respected tradesman of Newport, which occurred on Wednesday last, at the age of 64. The deceased was for many years a zealous local preacher in connection with the Wesleyan Society, and his presence was very familiar in most parts of the Isle of Wight. By his sterling integrity of character he commanded the esteem of all who knew him, and his death is deplored by a wide circle of friends. The funeral takes place on Monday afternoon, at Carisbrooke Cemetery, leaving the house of the deceased in Union-street at 3.30.

**OBITUARY.** – At half-past 9 on Wednesday evening death claimed another well-known townsman in the person of Mr. James Linington, ironmonger, of St. James's-square. The deceased suffered from a painful internal malady for several years past, and a few weeks since journeyed to London with a view of undergoing an operation. After his return he became worse, and suffered acute pain, from which, as before stated, he was released on Wednesday last. The deceased had been connected with the Wesleyan Church of this town for at least three decades, and was the oldest local preacher associated with the Newport and Cowes Circuit; but in matters of religion he was exceedingly broad, and nothing rejoiced him more than to hear of the prosperity of other Christian churches, especially of that of the Church of England, for which he entertained a warm regard. In politics the deceased was an out-and-out Conservative, and an active member of the Local Habitation of the Primrose League. He was in the sixty-fifth year of his age.
