DEATH OF MR. JAMES LIST. – The death occurred yesterday week at Clatterford Cottage, Carisbrooke, of Mr. James List, a well-known and much-esteemed resident of Carisbrooke for many years at the advanced age of 87. The deceased gentleman, whose grandfather founded the yacht-building yard at Fishbourne, went to Australia early in life, and on returning acquired the property where he has since resided and settled down there. He manifested much interest in local affairs, and rendered active and useful service in public life, being for some time a member of the old Highway Commissioners. He was enthusiastic in matters astronomical and geological, on which matters he was a contributor of interesting letters to our columns. He remained in very good health till a few weeks before his death, a cold contracted during the sharp weather towards the end of last year being the prelude to the illness which terminated fatally on Friday of last week. Respected by all who knew him, he will be missed by many, whose deep sympathy will be with the aged widow, who is herself on a bed of affliction. The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon, the interment being in the family vault at Carisbrooke Cemetery. In addition to the immediate relatives the mourners included Mr. G.A. Kingswell (Wellow Farm). Dr Groves, J.P. (medical attendant), and Mr. G.H. Brown (executor), and servants. The vicar of Carisbrooke (Rev. W.J. Stobart) officiated.
