

## Robert and Christina Logan

Isle of Wight Country Press – 27 May 1944

### NEWPORT.

**Husband and Wife Buried Together.** – The deaths took place last week of Mr. and Mrs. R. Logan, of 58 Worsley-road. Mrs. Christina Logan, who died on Thursday, was 54, and Mr. Robert Logan, who died on Saturday, was 53. Mr. Logan formerly carried on a boot and shoe repairing business in Lower St. James's-street. In the last war he served in the Royal Warwickshire Regiment, and in this war, until recently, in the Royal Engineers. For over 25 years he was a member of the Buffaloes, and had belonged to the Vectis, Grand, and Beatrice Lodges. The funeral was on Monday, the Rev. Father Lynch officiating at a service for Mrs. Logan in the Roman Catholic Church and the Vicar of Carisbrooke (the Rev. H. Ewbank) at the committal in one grave in Carisbrooke Cemetery. The mourners were Messrs. R., E., D., and G. Logan (sons, three of who are in the Army), Mrs. C. Hamilton, and Miss Logan (daughters), and Mrs. E. Logan (daughter-in-law). Others present were Mesdames L. Hamilton, C. Moses, N. Legg, and M. Friars. Representing the Buffaloes (Beatrice Lodge) were Bros. W. K. Baker, C. Frampton, S. Lockyer, J. Johnson, and C. Hunt. Messrs. O. C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements.
