DEATH OF A FORMER RESIDENT. – Many friends of Mr. C. H. Mallard, now residing at Bitterne Park, Southampton, and formerly of Newport, will deeply regret to hear that their second daughter, Miss Lilian Florence Mallard, aged 41, died at her parents' home, Sunnypatch, Monastery-road, Bitterne Park, on Friday week. She will be pleasantly remembered by her former school friends and others in Newport, whose sympathy will be extended to her parents and surviving sister (Mrs. Constance Clinton) in their sad loss. The father of the deceased (Mr. C. H. Mallard) formerly carried on a grocery business at Totland Bay and Newport, and afterwards occupied the position of verger at Newport Parish Church, where the funeral service of his daughter was held on Tuesday. The Vicar (the Rev. Canon C. H. Thompson) officiated at the church and at the interment in Carisbrooke Cemetery. The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. Mallard, Mrs. Clinton (eldest daughter), Mr. Mallard's sister from Whippingham, and Mrs. Kelleway (sister-in-law). There were also present Mr. and Mrs. A. Snow, Miss Elsie Snow, Mr. R. Groves (East Cowes), and Mr. S. Elliott. The funeral arrangements were carried out by Messrs. Moorman and Son.
