THE LATE MR. McSWINEY. - The funeral of Mr. John McSwiney, the closing years of whose long and honoured life were spent in peaceful retirement in Carisbrooke, took place on Tuesday last. The first part of the service was performed in Carisbrooke Church, the Vicar and the Rev. R. L. Monck Mason officiating, and there were sung two of the favourite hymns of the deceased, "Jesu, lover of my soul," and "Rock of Ages." The same clergymen officiated at the grave in Carisbrooke Cemetery. The chief mourners were Miss McSwiney, Mrs. Thompson and Mrs. Bain (daughters), and Mr. J. W. Thompson and Capt. Thompson, of the R.A. Staff College (grandsons). The nurse and servant also attended. There were a number of beautiful floral tributes offered by the children, the grandchildren, and personal friends of the lamented deceased, telling of the warm regard and affectionate remembrance of those who knew him best and loved him most. Many marks of mourning and respect were evidenced in Carisbrooke on the day of the funeral.
