#### NEWPORT.

**DEATH OF AN EX-POSTMAN.** – Mr. George Meech, a well-known local postman, passed away on Saturday last at the age of 48. The deceased was for over 20 years engaged in the postal service at Newport, from which he retired on a pension some six or seven years ago. He was an old member of the Carisbrooke Bowling Club and he belonged to Court Island Foresters. The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Thursday afternoon, the Rev. A. E. Johns (Baptist) officiating. In addition to the family mourners and a number of friends, several members of the Post-office staff and postman attended, including Messrs. W. H. Wood (chief clerk), H. Brummell, C. H. Coombes, A. Snow, and W. A. Furnage (clerical department), Wadmore, Odell, Lane, Livingstone, Kelly, Pratchett, E. J. Abraham, F. Mew, W. Watson, and H. Burt, the last four acting as bearers. Mr. G. Holmes (chief ranger) read the Foresters' service at the grave-side. The floral tributes included one from the staff at the Newport Post-office.
