DEATH OF MRS. H.W. MOREY. - We deeply regret to record the death of Mrs. Henry William Morey, the widow of one who bore a useful part in the public life of Newport, and whose death, greatly to the loss of the community, occurred only some eighteen months ago. The deceased lady, who never quite recovered from the shock of this bereavement, had been for some time in failing health, and the end came very peacefully on Monday last. So long as her heath permitted, she zealously identified herself with all good works in connection with the St. James's-street Congregational Church, of which her husband was for many years a deacon, and touching expression has been given to the profound feeling of regret which her departure has evoked. She took a very active interest in the P.T.E., of which she was a vice-president, and at the meeting of the Society on Thursday evening pathetic evidence was afforded of the affection in which she was held by the members, whose sorrow and sympathy were feelingly expressed in a letter of condolence which it was decided to send to the bereaved daughter. She was also a valued worker in connection with local benevolent societies, and she will be greatly missed there as well as in many homes which she often brightened by her cheery presence and kindly help. The deepest sympathy of the whole community is with the bereaved relatives, and in a very especial manner will that sympathy be extended to Mrs. McKay, the devoted daughter and only surviving child of the lamented deceased. The funeral takes place at Carisbrooke Cemetery at 3 o'clock this (Saturday) afternoon.
