DEATH OF MR. HARRY MORGAN

His many friends in the town and district heard with regret of the death, which took place rather suddenly on Friday week at 15 Drill Hall-road, of Mr. Henry Thomas Morgan, aged 63, well known as a carpenter and joiner and as an active member of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows. He was the eldest son of the late Mr. T. Morgan, of Chillerton, and had worked at his trade in the Newport district practically all his adult life. For some years following the last war he was associated with Mr. Newnham, of Gatcombe, in erecting houses in the suburbs of the town, but since the outbreak of the present war he had been a member of the staff of Messrs. H.W. Morey and Sons. He was a Past Grand Master, Tyler, and member of the Management and Juvenile Committees of the Oddfellows Lodge, treasurer of the branch of the Carpenters' and Joiners' Union, and a member of the Court of Referees and Hardship Committee dealing with the claims by workers in the building trades. He was a man highly esteemed as a craftsman and helpful friend, and much sympathy was aroused with his wife and son in their unexpected loss.

The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Tuesday, the Rev. H. Ewbank officiating. The chief mourners were his son (Mr. L.H. Morgan), and Messrs. P.C. Morgan (brother), E. and W. Jacobs (brothers in-law), F. and R. Morgan (cousins), A.D. Callaway (representing Mr. C.V. Cheverton secretary of the Oddfellows Lodge, who was indisposed), and Mr. W.F. Barber, Messrs. F. Cooper, G. Carpenter, and F. Wapshott represented the Carpenters' and Joiners' Union, and the following members of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows attended: Bros. A. Scott, P.P.G.M., and W.J. Way, P.P.G.M. (Trustees), F. Cheverton, N.G., T. Buckler, P.P.G.M., J.M. Sibbick, P.G., F.C. Allee, P.G., A.E. Allee, P.G., F. Cooper, P.G., and R. Turner, P.G. Mr. H.M. Ablitt, P.P.G.M., represented the District. Bros. J.B. Alderslade, Prov. C.S., and G. Attrill, Provincial Grand Master, were prevented from attending, the last-named through illness, and Mr. C. Fletcher was also unable to attend. Among the floral tributes were those from Messrs. H.W. Morey and Sons, the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, and the Carpenters' and Joiners' Union. Messrs. O.C. Hamilton and Son made the arrangements. - The widow and son wish to thank Dr Straton for his kind attention, also all friends and neighbours for letters of sympathy and beautiful flowers.
