**DEATH OF MR. A.W. MORRIS.** – The death occurred on Thursday, at 81 Castle-road, Newport, of Mr. Alfred [sic] William Morris, aged 69, a well-known and esteemed Island agriculturist. Deceased was for some 12 years tenant of Great Pan Farm. He was formerly for eight years tenant of Rowlands Farm. He was previously at Dungewood Dairy, and prior to that for a few years he was at the Commercial Hotel, Sandown. A pathetic feature of his death is that only on Wednesday last deceased and his wife, Mrs. Jane Sarah Morris, were elected at the annual meeting of the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution as married pensioners of that Institution, the joint pension being £40 per annum. The Island votes were concentrated on this case, and Mr. C. Webb (Mayor of Newport) and local representative of the institution, attended Wednesday's meeting in their support, Mr. and Mrs. Morris received 732 votes, this number being next to the highest (901).

THE FUNERAL – of the late Mr. Albert William Morris, formerly of Great Pan, whose death at the age of 69 was recorded in our last issue, took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Sunday afternoon, the Rev.
