NEWPORT

Pte. Samuel John Oram, Dorset Regiment, aged 34, died at Portsmouth on the 8th inst. from gun-shot wounds in the shoulder received in France. He was a Reservist when war broke out, and was in the first part of the fighting in Mesopotamia, but came home on leave after two years' absence. He then went to France where he has been serving since. He had been wounded three times previously. Prior to the war he was employed by Messrs. J. Thomas, Ltd. He married only a year ago. His home was with Mr. H. J. Linington, at 23 New-street, where his wife, with whom much sympathy is felt, is lying ill. The funeral took place with full military honours at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Tuesday, the Rev. J. L. Spratt officiating. The R.G.A. at Parkhurst provided the firing party and escort. There were many floral tributes.
