DEATH OF MAJOR PATTINSON. – We have to record the death of Major Pattinson, which occurred at his residence at Carisbrooke on Sunday evening. For some weeks the gallant officer^chad been dangerously ill, and from the outset the case was regarded as a serious one. He was one of the oldest worshippers at Carisbrooke Parish Church, and for several years, during the incumbency of the Rev. E. Boucher James, he filled the office of warden. The Major had held a commission in the Wight Artillery Militia, from which regiment he retired several years ago. Among the subjects claiming his attention in later years was the work of the St John's Ambulance Association, in which he deeply interested himself. Carisbrooke loses a familiar figure by his death. Major Patterson was in his 80th year.
