DEATH OF THE LATE FATHER LAWRENCE PEACH.

News has reached Stroud of the death of the Rev. Father Lawrence Peach, which occurred at Carisbrooke, Isle of Wight, on Tuesday. He was 76 years of age, and for 20 years he was in charge of the Roman Catholic Church at Beeches Green. He was appointed chaplain of the convent at Carisbrooke seven years ago. Father Lawrence Peach was a genial soul, beloved by all.

CONVENT PRIEST'S FUNERAL. – The funeral of the Venerable Father Laurence Peach, priest of the Dominican Convent took place on Saturday at Carisbrooke Cemetery, On Wednesday week a solemn dirge was sung at the Convent, and the remains lay in state until Saturday morning, when a requiem was sung by the Right Rev. W.T. Cotter (Bishop of Portsmouth). His lordship also conducted the impressive interment service, assisted by Father Bede Jarrett (Provincial O.P.), Father Humbert Everest (ex-Provincial O.P.), and Father Kelly (Shanklin). The Rev. Dom Noetinger (Prior of Quarr Abbey) was also present. The body was enclosed in a plain elm coffin bearing the following inscription: "Wen. F. Laurence Peach, O.P., P.G., born 21st April, 1845, died 29th July, 1919. R.I.P." There were no flowers. Mr. F. Spanner, of Newport, carried out the funeral arrangements.
