DEATH OF MR. WILLIAM PECK. – We regret to record the death, which took place on Tuesday morning after a three weeks' illness, of Mr. William Peck, the popular host of the Brown Jug, Carisbrooke-road. The deceased, who was 48 years of age, was the third son of the late Mr. John Peck, of Pitt Place, Mottiston, and for close upon a quarter of a century he had managed the business at the hostelry named, having been the licensee since his mother's death some years ago. Genial and good natured, and a true sportsman, the late Mr. Peck was warmly esteemed by a wide circle of friends associated with the societies and social and sports clubs with which he was connected, and by the public generally. His death, in the prime of his manhood, is deplored by all who knew him, and the deepest sympathy is with his widow, and his brothers and sisters and other relatives in their bereavement. The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery yesterday (Friday), the Vicar of St. John's (the Rev. Douglas C. W. Harrison) impressively officiating. The mourners were Messrs. Alfred, Frederick, and Edward Peck (brothers), Mr. T. Coffin (uncle), Messrs. W. and F. Peck (nephews), Messrs. H. Coffin and W. Hewitt (cousins), Messrs. C. Barham (brother-in-law), C. Cave, G. Henton, Fry (Ryde), F. Sheath, Richardson, and Daish (Shanklin), and representatives of the Sunflower, Primrose, Britannia, and George Clubs and others, including Messrs. T. Smith, F.
