DEATH OF MR. EDWARD PECK. – Much regret and sympathy have been called forth by the death on Saturday, after a comparatively short illness of Mr. Edward Peck, the popular landlord of the Brown Jug, at the age of 45. The deceased, who was married less than two years ago, was well known and respected in the town and Island, having formerly been employed at the Carisbrooke Brewery, and subsequently he was at the George yard. He afterwards succeeded his brother, the late Mr. William Peck, as licensee of the Brown Jug. He was a Forester and Shepherd of some years standing, and a member of the I.W. Licensed Victuallers Association. The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Wednesday, the Rev. E. W. T. Greenshield (St. John's) impressively officiating and speaking on the words "We shall all have to go," which were used to him by the deceased when returning from a funeral a short time since. The mourners were the widow, Messrs. Alfred and Fred Peck (brothers), deceased's two sisters, Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Bunce, Mr. C. Barham (nephew), Messrs. H. and A. Coffin (cousins), and Mr. F. Turtle. There were also present Mr. C. J. Dashwood, a number of members of the I.W. Licensed Victuallers Association, and others, including Messrs. A.O. Morris, Richardson, Weeks, C. White, J.A. McQueen, N.H.T. Mursell, Wheeler, W. Plumbley, W. Bull, and Mr. and Mrs. West. There were a number of floral tributes. Mr. O.C. Hamilton carried out the funeral arrangements.
