DEMISE OF MISS PEEL. — Our obituary records the demise of Miss Peel on the day of her father's funeral. On Tuesday the remains of the deceased were removed to the Chapel of St Thomas of Canterbury, in Pyle-street, where Rev. Father Fryer, with acolites, received them with due solemnity. The coffin, on which were placed many bouquets of sweet flowers and immortelles, was placed on a catafalque, studded with a silver crucifix and six yellow wax lights in silver candlesticks, and matins and lauds were sung. The altars, pulpit, and benches were draped with black cloth. Newxt morning (Wednesday) Requiem Mass was sung, and the remains were hearsed and conveyed to the grave in Carisbrooke Cemetery.
