The Funeral – of Pilot Officer Harold F. (Jim) Perrott, R.A.F.V.R., who was found after being reported missing in April, took place at Carisbrooke on Monday. Pilot Officer Perrott, who was 26, was the elder son of the late Mr. Frank J. Perrott, of Southampton, and Mrs. Beatrice J. Perrott, now of The Meade, Wilver-road, Newport. The service at Carisbrooke Church, at which the Rev. H. Ewbank was present, was conducted by the Rev. L. J. D. Wheatley. In his address the latter spoke feelingly of the enthusiasm and cheerfulness with which deceased at all times carried out his duties. His family, though suffering a great loss, had a memory of which to be justly proud. The mourners were Mrs. B. J. Perrott (mother), Mr. G. B. Perrott and Mrs. K. B. Alderslade (brother and sister), Messrs. R. J. Dawes, W. Bassett (uncles), J. B. Alderslade, E. U. Taylor, M. B. Thomas, and N. Hicks. Mrs. L. J. D. Wheatley and Mrs. H. Ewbabk were also present. Beautiful floral tributes included one from the officer commanding an R.A.F. station, and another from the officer commanding and all ranks of 245 Squadron R.A.F. Messrs. H. and F. Damp made the arrangements.
