DEATH OF MR. P. C. V. PINHORN. – The death occurred after a long illness at the I.W. Infirmary, on Sunday, of Mr. Percy C. Vincent Pinhorn, aged 58, of Castle-road, a well-known resident, who was an acknowledged expert in campanology. For many years he was a member of the band of ringers at the Parish Church, he gave valuable advice to the committee who were responsible for re-casting Carisbrooke Church bells, and the sound of handbells, on which he was a skilled performer, could often be heard proceeding from his residence, which he named Belfry House. Mr. Pinhorn was a member of the Conservative Club. At the funeral at Carisbrooke Cemetery, on Thursday, five of the Parish Church ringers (Messrs. W. Chambers, W. Upton, A. Callaway, W. Johnson, and E.A. Young) rang a course of Grandaire triples on handbells at the graveside.
