**NEWPORT**

SERIOUS FALL FROM AN OMNIBUS. – On Monday afternoon, as Mr. Salter, proprietor of the Castle Hotel, Carisbrooke, was driving his omnibus up the High-street, he suddenly fell from his seat into the road. He pitched on his head, receiving a tremendous blow on the temple, which, it is feared, will prove fatal. P.C. W. Attrill was promptly on the spot, and assisted in the removal of the unfortunate man to the hotel at Carisbrooke. He was attended by Drs. Foster and Wilkins. It is said that Mr. Salter was tucking his rug round his legs when he fell - Mr Salter died on Wednesday morning. At an inquest held the same day a verdict of accidental death was returned.
