Death of Mrs. B. Sanders. - The death occurred rather suddenly on Sunday at her home, Springvale, Spring Lane, of Mrs. Alice Sanders, aged 82, widow of Mr. B. Sanders, C.A., who died in 1940. She was the last surviving child of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Hale, of Newport House Dairy, and was one of the oldest members of the Newport Congregational Church, where she was actively associated with the Congregational Woman's Guild and had continued to work at home for the cause until a few days before her death. The funeral was on Wednesday, a service at the Newport Congregational Church being conducted by the Rev, Dr. N. Spoor. Mr. A. Mearman, at the organ... Dr. Spoor paid tribute to Mrs. Sanders' work for the church and her Christian life. The mourners were Mr. L. Sanders (son), Miss M. Sanders (daughter), Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Sanders (son and daughter-inlaw), Mr. and Mrs. F. Linington, Mr. and Mrs. H. H. Morris, Mr. and Mrs. Harold Gray, Mr. and Mrs. Horace Gray, Messrs. W. Sanders and W. H. Brown, the Misses L. and R. Smart, and Miss I. Stephens, who also represented Mrs. P. Stephens (nephews and nieces), Mrs. M. Sanders and Miss A. Sanders (sisters-in-law), Miss D. Stephens (cousin), Mrs. C. Burt (great niece), Miss M. Tatford, and Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Sutton. [only family mourners transcribed] The interment was in her husband's grave at Carisbrooke Cemetery, and there were nearly 30 floral tributes, including those from the Newport V.A. Detachment (of which Miss Sanders is commandant) and the Congregational Woman's Guild. Messrs. H. and F. Damp made the arrangements.
