## **NEWPORT**

**Death and Funeral of Mr. John Sanders.**—On Saturday last death removed the familiar figure of an old and much respected townsman in Mr. John Sanders, who had reached the allotted span of three score years and ten. The deceased was in business as a fruiterer and florist in the High-street up to within a few years ago, when he retired. He had been in failing health for some time past. The late Mr. Sanders was very well known in local cricket circles, having in his younger days taken an active part in the game, whilst he still retained a very keen interest in the favourite summer pastime. The present generation will remember him as an umpire, in which direction he often gave his valued services. His was a regular attendant at the matches on the Newport ground and umpired several times last season. He was one of the senior members of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows, having since May 30th, 1882 (over 25 years) been a trustee of the Lodge. He had held the highest office in the Lodge, to whose interests he was devoted, and he was held in the very warmest esteem by his brethren as by all who knew him. The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Tuesday afternoon, the Rev. G. Avery (Congregational) officiating. The chief mourners were Messrs. James, Ben, and Fred Sanders (cousins), and Mr. C. Stephens. A number of officers and members of the Earl Yarborough Lodge of Oddfellows attended to pay a last tribute of respect to their departed brother, amongst them being Bros. G. H. Locke, J. Taylor, and H. Prouten (deceased's fellow trustees), H. Lower, N.G., C. Steel (secretary), J. B. Alderslade (Prov. C.S.), T. H. Walden (treasurer and lecture master), C. Radcliffe (warden), A. Scott (elective secretary), Frank King, F. J. Martin, J. Woolgar, M. Blake, W. E. Wickens, W. Fuller, and H. W. Dore, and Messrs. E. Jacobs and S. P. Whitcombe. By deceased's request there were no flowers. On the coffin was the inscription "John Sanders, died Oct 21st, 1905, aged 70 years". Mr. F. Spanner was the undertaker.
