Master Baker's Death. – The funeral takes place to-day (Saturday), at St. John's Church of Mr. Edward James Shepard, of Suncroft, 121 Medina Avenue, who died on Wednesday at the Count Hospital, aged 75. He had been in indifferent health since he had a fall in the snow two years ago. Mr. Shepard, who formerly lived at 57 Trafalgar Road, was a master baker. He commenced work with Messrs. Wray when he was 11, and was later employed by Messrs. Westmore in Nodehill, until he and his brother took over the business on the death of their father. Mr. Shepard, who leaves a widow and a daughter (Mrs. S. Scott), lost his elder son in the 1914-18 war and his younger son when a bomb fell in Messrs. Morey & Son's timberyard during the war.
