DEATH OF MR. C. STARK. – The death occurred suddenly at 24 Hearn-street, the residence of his sister-in-law (Mrs. Stark) on Friday week of Mr. Clement Stark, who was for many years a saddler employed by the late Mr. Richard Bird Cheverton in Lugley-street. He was 73 years of age, and had suffered from paralysis for many years. During his 20 years as a harness maker Mr. Stark assisted in making harness for the horses in the Royal stables at Osborne House in Queen Victoria's days. The funeral took place on Tuesday at Carisbrooke Cemetery, the Rev. W. H. Mackinnon (vicar of St. John's) officiating. The mourners were Messrs. George and Edgar Stark (brothers), H. and R. Roberts (Chale), E. Shepard, and R. Wyatt. Mr H. W. Parnell made the arrangements.
