### NEWPORT.

SUDDEN DEATH. - An old and respected inhabitant of Shide, Mr. George Stevens, recently living with his son at Clarence-road, Newport, died with painful suddenness on Thursday, at the age of 75. In the morning he went to do some gardening at Shide Mill, and whilst talking to the miller, Mr. Edmund James Wakely, suddenly staggered and fell and expired immediately. Deceased has two sons in the County Constabulary. He was a regular attendant at the Newport Wesleyan Church. An inquest was held last (Friday) evening at the Mission-room, Clarence-road, by the Deputy Coroner (F.A. Joyce, Esq.), when the evidence showed that death was due to heart failure, and a verdict accordingly was returned.
