RETIRED FARMER'S DEATH. – As briefly announced last week, a well known and greatly respected Island farmer passed to his rest, at the age of 76 years, on Monday week in the person of Mr. Henry Stickland. The deceased was a Dorset man who came to the Island some 46 years ago, and for 25 years farmed Great East Standen, retiring about seven years ago, since when he had resided in Newport. He celebrated his golden wedding in April, 1925, and up to with a few months of his death had enjoyed the best of health. The funeral took place on Thursday week at Carisbrooke Cemetery, the Rev. H.S. Footman (vicar of Carisbrooke) officiating. The chief mourners were Mr. W. Stickland (son), Mr. and Mrs. A. Carter, Mr. and Mrs. H. I. Digby, Mr. W. W. Heal, and Mr. and Mrs. W. Barton (sons-in-law and daughters), Mr. E. Barton (son-in-law), Mr. R. Carter (grandson),
