DEATH OF MR. W. H. TEE – Much regret was occasioned on Thursday at the news of the somewhat sudden death from heart trouble of Mr. William Tee, aged 58, of Victoria Cottage, Heytesbury-road, a well known local church worker and horticulturist. Mr. Tee had served 20 years at Parkhurst Prison as clerk to the foreman of works and retired on pension just over a year ago. For some years he was a prominent worker, Sunday-school teacher, and chorister at St. John's Church, and latterly he had been associated with the Society of Friends and had done much appreciated Christian work as a visitor at the Poor Law Institution at Parkhurst. A keen and able gardener, he was a valued member of the I.W. Horticultural Association, serving for some years as collector, and he had contributed to the interesting and instructive papers given at the Association's meetings. He also frequently officiated as a judge at Island horticultural shows, and was for a time hon. secretary of the Carisbrooke Cottage Garden Society. He was an enthusiastic worker in any good cause. He leaves a widow and two sons, with whom much sympathy is felt. The funeral takes place this (Saturday) afternoon at Carisbrooke Cemetery at 2.30.
