DEATH OF MRS. J. THOMAS. – We regret to record the death, which occurred on Sunday morning, after a brief illness from pneumonia, of Mrs. J. Thomas, wife of Mr. James Thomas, J.P., C.A. (vice-chairman of the County Council), at the age of 63. The deceased lady was ever ready to render assistance in connection with public and other work with which her husband has been identified in our midst for so many years, particularly in connection with the various agencies associated with the Congregational Church and benevolent work in the town, and her estimable qualities had won her a wide circle of friends, whose deepest sympathy is with Mr. Thomas and his family in their irreparable bereavement. Sympathetic reference was made to the sad occurrence by the Rev. Arthur Jones at last Sunday's service in the Congregational Church, and a resolution of sympathy with Mr. Thomas was passed at a meeting in connection with the Newport Free Church Council on Tuesday evening, and the County Council meeting on Wednesday, as reported in another column. The funeral took place at Carisbrooke Cemetery on Thursday afternoon amid general signs of sympathy. The Rev. Arthur Jones impressively officiated. The family mourners were Mr. James Thomas, J.P., C.A. (husband), Messrs. Leigh and Clive Thomas (sons), Mesdames Poole and Turley (daughters), Mrs. Rhys Thomas (sister), Mr. Tom Turley (son-in-law), Mr. William Wyles (brother-in-law), Mrs. Cottam, Mr. and Mrs. H. W. Morey, Mr. and Mrs. G. D. Rich, Mr. Gladstone May, Miss Brown, Dr. Harold Shaw, and Dr. Raymond.....The grave was lined with evergreens, and the coffin bore the inscription "Jane Thomas, died December 13th, 1908, aged 63 years." Mr. J. Bevis carried out the funeral arrangements.
